Two Lights for Tomorrow at Ohio Statehouse on April 18 to Commemorate 250th Anniversary of Paul Revere's Ride

What:

- The Ohio Statehouse will display two lights in the building's cupola shortly after 8 p.m. on Friday, April 18, 2025, to honor the 250th anniversary of Paul Revere's legendary ride to alert Massachusetts minutemen that the British army was approaching prior to the battles of Lexington and Concord.
- The event is part of the nationwide "Two Lights for Tomorrow" initiative, which seeks to symbolize unity, remembrance, and a collective call to action.
- America 250-Ohio encourages various public buildings throughout the state, as well as private homes, to participate by displaying two lights on the evening of April 18.
- This initiative aims to promote a sense of unity and historical reflection as Ohioans and Americans nationwide embark on the journey toward the nation's 250th birthday.

About America 250-Ohio:

In 2026, the United States will celebrate its semiquincentennial, which is the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence. Each state has been encouraged to create a celebration and commemoration of this anniversary to reflect the unique character and contributions of each state to the nation over the past 250 years. Ohio is fully embracing this opportunity. The Ohio Commission for the Semiquincentennial (aka America 250-Ohio Commission or AM250-OH) was created by the Ohio legislature and launched on March 1, 2022. The charge of the AM250-OH Commission is to "...to plan, encourage, develop, and coordinate the commemoration of the two hundred fiftieth anniversary of the founding of the United States and the impact of Ohioans on the nation's past, present, and future." — Ohio Revised Code (149.309).
